What should I pray?

On a recent visit to my sister-and brother-in law's, I was playing and talking with my 2-year-old nephew. As we interacted, he was talking to me, but with his limited vocabulary, I couldn't always understand what he was saying. I found myself looking to his parents for understanding. What is he trying to say to me? They knew exactly what he was trying to say and interpreted for me. Sometimes when we face difficult situations, we may not always know what to pray. Just like my nephew's parents interpreting for him, the Spirit knows what we need and voices our requests for us, communicating our deepest needs to our heavenly Father.

Paul tells us in Romans 8:26, "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words."
