#### **Pursuit**

A few years ago, I reconnected with an old pastor friend I hadn't seen in a long time. At first, our conversation was filled with catching up—talking about life, ministry, and family. But as we kept talking, I realized something: though we had been friends for years, we had slowly drifted apart. Not because of any conflict, but simply because we hadn't made the effort to stay connected.

That experience made me think about my relationship with God. It's easy to say we love Him, but are we truly pursuing Him? Jesus tells us in Matthew 6:33, "Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you." The pursuit of God isn't something we're supposed to add to our lives when it's convenient—it should be our first and highest priority!

For Paul, knowing Christ was worth more than anything else. He wrote in Philippians 3:8, "Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." That wasn't just a theological statement—it was the practical reality that shaped his life. Paul's relationship with God wasn't passive, it was marked by intentionality.

So how about us? Do we treat our relationship with God as something to maintain when we have time or as the greatest treasure we have? We pursue God primarily through the ordinary means of grace—hearing His Word preached, praying with His people, and receiving the Lord's Supper in gathered worship. But this pursuit doesn't stop when we leave church. It continues as we seek Him daily in Scripture, prayer, and obedience. He has already pursued us in Christ—now, by His grace, let's pursue Him!

The following reflection is written by Mrs. Elly Pearlman, a devoted volunteer, supporter, and prayer partner of EWA.



"A DEDICATION FOR MRS. ROSE BIEGLER! I am one of the only few people outside of the immediate family who knew her when she was younger. You see, she was a second mother to me. I have known Anna (nee Biegler) since we were five years old. We would walk to one another's house every day and check out what each house was planning for dinner and decide where we would eat!

Mrs. B. would be in the kitchen making German food to die for. She was always smiling and always ready to comfort you if a bad day appeared on the horizon. The happiest I remember seeing her was when she was given charge over a homeless infant. She radiated love for this precious child. About 2 years ago, Anna brought her down to see me. She told me a story about comforting me when I had run to their house crying because I had broken one of my mother's favorite figurines. I don't remember it, but in her retelling it - I knew she had comforted me and dried my tears!

Her passing makes me so sad, but I know she is in Heaven, smiling her great smile for our precious Lord and Savior. In this I have great comfort. I loved her! This donation is made in her precious memory. **Cynthia Maser**"
